THE SEASON OF LENT

Т

he festivities of Christmas are now a fading memory and the Christian year turns once again to the season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday (10th February this year).

From the earliest days of the Christian Church the 40 days of Lent have been recognised as a time of fasting and abstinence, commemorating the 40 days of self-denial that Jesus spent in the wilderness, prior to beginning His ministry.

The word Lent derives from the Saxon word *lenct,* which merely means Spring (and has the same derivation as 'lengthen' - ie. the lengthening of days).

Now Spring is associated with daffodils, catkins in the hedgerows and lambs in the fields; but Spring had very different connotations in Saxon and mediaeval times.

It was associated with hardship and frugality as the winter stores of food ran

low and the possibility of starvation was ever present, and so it was an appropriate time for fasting and self-denial.

A batter of eggs, milk and butter was a suitable way of using up the last of the winter store of these foods before Lent. That tradition continues to this day with Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday, being referred to as 'pancake day'.

Christians recognise Lent not just as a time for self-denial and fasting, but also for the positive actions of meditation and of 'spring cleaning' their lives. The modern trend of fasting for health has led to research suggesting that fasting can have a positive effect on mental capacity, a fact recognised perhaps by our ancient Christian ancestors.
