

**Colour** - it's wonderful now that we have some days of sunshine and can appreciate the colours all around us in the

gardens and fields; and the grass is so green

and lush, in this burst of growth that has followed Spring's eventual arrival.

Green is a colour which will feature in church

for the next few months. Our churches use the liturgical colours of the Church of England, which means that the robes and altar frontals are purple in Advent and Lent, White at Christmas, Easter and Trinity, red at Pentecost and Good Friday, and then Green the rest of the time. (There are two pink Sundays as well - if you know when these occur, answers on a postcard please!)

Green is used in what's called "ordinary time", which has just started, after Trinity Sunday. This is because the church calendar is based on the agricultural year, and during the summer months, folk used to be too busy working on the land to do much in church, so the major feasts and festivals fall in winter and spring.

Perhaps the period after Trinity should be called "extraordinary" - because on Trinity Sunday we celebrate that God is three in one; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Trinity is when we ponder the mystery that God is both transcendent (out there, other) and immanent (right here, within us and creation).

There are usually at least 20 Sundays after Trinity, so we have a good while to think about this. Many scholars have tried to explain the nature of God, and many theologians have argued and fought over what we should believe. Really, the nature of God cannot be explained - only experienced.

If your life is lacking a bit of colour, or if you don't feel the warmth of his presence along with the summer sun, why not try coming to church - come and join us in these Sundays after Trinity - the Green season. You never know - your life might just blossom and colour, as we start to mix in the white, purple, red and pink later in the year.
