As I write this, the news is all about the disaster in the Philippines and the devastation wrought by typhoon Haiyan. Our thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by this disaster.

The news is also full of the incredible amount of money raised in the UK for both this disaster and for the Children in Need appeal. £31 million so far for Children in Need, and over £13 million to the Philippines (and this figure is rising all the time).

Amazing! The generosity of the British public is phenomenal, especially as we are only just emerging from a long recession, and facing the costs of winter and Christmas.

Giving is an integral part of Christmas and this custom has ancient roots. The Romans, before the birth of Jesus, held end of year celebrations to honour Saturn, god of harvest, and Mithras, god of light. Fine meals, wine and giving presents were all part of the festivities.

When Jesus was born the Magi came from the east, bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. St Nicholas, who was a bishop in 4th century Myra (in Asia Minor) was known for his kindness and generosity, especially towards children. According to tradition, he threw 3 bags of gold coins into a poor man's house to save him from selling his daughters. These gold coins landed in stockings hanging above the fire, and so the tradition of Christmas stockings was born. St Nicholas (whose feast day is 6th December) has evolved into the modernday Santa Claus.

And giving at Christmas has evolved into an often frenzied, stressful, expensive and unnecessary activity. This year, as we enter the season of Advent, then Christmas, hopefully we will have time amidst the consumer rush, to reflect on the extraordinary generosity of British people all around us. Hopefully we will applaud this giving to the vulnerable and needy and realise that, paradoxically, giving to those who really need it, also enriches our lives. As St Francis said: **"It is in giving that we receive".**
