Some February facts, folklore and traditions

Weather sayings

February fill-dyke' springs to mind first of all. So true after the soggy winter so far, although we have been fortunate compared to so many. However, if we want it dry, bear in mind 'Of all the months of the year, curse a fair February', and 'When a cat lies in the sun in February, she will creep behind the stove in March', and finally 'If February gives much snow, a fine summer it doth foreshow'. Who knows? Only time will tell.

2nd February is Candlemass Day

40 days after the birth of a Jewish boy it was the custom for the mother to attend the temple for ritualistic purification and then the baby was presented to God in the temple in Jerusalem by



the thankful parents. When Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple, Simeon met them and held the baby in his arms, saying 'this is the Light of the World'. He then uttered the beautiful prayer which we now know as the Nunc Dimittus, having been told by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Christ: "Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace".

In pagan times it was a festival of light as this day marks the midpoint of winter, half-way between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. A turning point when the sun begins to regain strength and we look forward to the end of darkness. Gradually this festival developed into a Christian service of blessing all the candles to be used throughout the year in church - hence "Candle mass"!

14th February, Valentine's Day

St Valentine was a bishop and martyr in the 3rd century. Little is reliably known about him, apart from the fact that he was a Christian Roman and was imprisoned for helping other Christians, being put to death on the 14th. He was thought to have performed marriages for Roman soldiers when it was forbidden, and therefore was credited with love and compassion.

This was the day it was believed that birds chose their mates and began nest building. Many superstitions and stories have developed over the ages, but traditionally it is a day of love and happiness.

May we all find love and happiness in the days ahead, an end to the mud (or will it be snow when this is circulated?) and pleasure in looking forward to spring.
