

C o, Lent is nearly upon us. This is the Itime in the Church's year when Christians traditionally give up something they enjoy for a period of about 40 days. In mediaeval times this season of fasting would mean no meat, no fish, no dairy produce, no sweet treats and no wine!

In recent times chocolate has been a favoured item to forego, and some Christians feel that Lent should be a time when they don't give up anything, but do something extra - like give to charity or spend more time in prayer and reflection.

Why do we make Lent a special season? Well, Lent is based on the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, fasting and enduring temptations, and this has evolved into a time of fasting before we celebrate the most important feast of the Christian year -Faster.

The point of making Lent different (either by fasting or doing something extra) is to make us more aware of ourselves: to

examine our strengths and weaknesses. It's not just a test of whether we can do without chocolate or meat for 40 days, but also a chance to look at how we are doing in the light of God's love and purpose for us.

Just as we might have an annual review in secular employment, Lent is a time when we can look at ourselves - what are we doing really well, and what needs improvement?

We are all a mixture of saint and sinner, and in Lent we can perhaps make one change, do something different, and jolt ourselves out of complacency.

So whether you are practically perfect, or a work in progress, have a go at doing something different in Lent. You can join our Lent course on Wednesday evenings at Saltby Methodist church, or give up chocolate.

Whatever you do, make Lent count, and let God's grace work in you.
