GREEN MEN

fter the beginning of St Augustine's mission to convert the English to Christianity, which dates from the late 6th century, many pre-Christian sites, festivals, deities and symbols were adopted and adapted to fit in with the new religion.

One of the most common reminder of this is the Green Man, which can be found carved in wood and stone in probably the majority of medieval churches in England. It is common too throughout northern Europe. The Green man was the Celtic pagan symbol of the wild wood and an image of fertility and of the endurance of nature. The Green Man is often associated with Cerunnos, a stag horned deity who lived in woods and controlled all living things.

In the medieval Christian church the Green Man became a symbol of new and everlasting life promised by the message of Easter and the Resurrection.

These male heads are wreathed in foliage which is typically growing from their mouths, eyes, ears and nostrils. Despite their surreal appearance Green Men are generally depicted as benign and gentle and not a thing to be feared. (See this example from St Bartholomew's church at Sproxton).



The Green Man is the May King or Jack-in-the-Green of the May Day ceremonies, which are still celebrated in rural England.
