"MARVELLOUS IN ORDINARY"

In a small coastal village in North Norfolk, something extraordinary happens every summer lasting for a month. Cley 15 is a contemporary Art Exhibition, first held at Salthouse in 2001 but now based in and around St Margaret's church in Cley. It is a large, light and airy building which in medieval times overlooked a busy harbour, but is now the village green! Over the years the exhibition has grown in popularity and in stature, and never fails to surprise and delight. The theme this year is "Marvellous in Ordinary" and shows just how amazing everyday things can be.

The altar covering in the church is stunning. A combination of scallops form the main centre area with floating panels of squares down each side. The colour ranges from white to varying shades of cream, gold and brown - one of the most striking cloths I have ever seen.

On closer inspection it is an exhibit. The official description reads as follows:

"This cloth is made from ordinary tea bags gathered from a diverse population of social classes where a cup of tea facilitates everyday communion of body, mind and soul. On the altar table residual stains and marks are transformed into marvellous beauty by the light that shines through".

Wendy Shaw (the artist) is a maker of meaning, using materials and processes to understand more about life, humanity and divinity. She enjoys giving value and place to the insignificant, discarded, and that which can be deemed unworthy.



A tea bag will never be the same again!

It reminded me of a fragment of "Auguries of Innocence", a poem by William Blake:

To see a World in a grain of sand And Heaven in a wild flower, Hold infinity in the palm of your hand And Eternity in an hour
