

he vicarage is full of bin bags, boxes, piles of paperwork, thank you cards, photos, service sheets and countless other mementoes of my time here.

My mind is full of memories - of the wonderful confirmation service, school events, harvests, funerals, baptisms, weddings. I recall services in the snow with just six in the congregation, and enormous Christmas services with over 100 present. The children's choir fills me with joy and the loss of those who have died leaves a sadness too.

The growth of Messy church, first communions and Lent groups has been wonderful, yet the theft of lead from Croxton roof has been harrowing and horrendous, but even this was met by a heart warming and incredibly generous response from the village.

I am full of awe and admiration at the daily sacrifice of time, money, effort and energy so many of you make, and have made over the years, in opening churches, cleaning, visiting those in need, praying and countless other tasks.

On a personal note, during my time here my mother died and my eldest daughter was married. What a privilege it has been to live and work amongst you! The richness of life in these parishes, both joys and sorrows, will stay with me.

I don't find change easy and yet we can't stop change - we see it all around us, especially now at harvest time when the land around us is transformed. We see it in our own lives and in our families, and as I move to Leicester, change is upon us again.

The one constant in all of this is the love of God - as Jesus says at the end of Matthew's gospel: "I will be with you till the end of the age". This constancy is experienced in our faith, and symbolized by the presence of our beautiful buildings which have been here for hundreds of years. As you move into a time of interregnum, be confident that the church here (and that includes you, the people) is strong and resilient.

Thank you so very much for all you do to keep the Christian faith alive and well in the benefice, and for all you do to keep the church buildings open and in good order. I, personally, would like to thank you for your support and friendship, which have been invaluable.
