REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

At a recent military parade in Leicester, there was a small party carrying banners decrying war and the use of the Armed Forces. After the parade was over someone said: "Who is going to tell them that they are only able to protest, due to the fact that we are a free country?"

We all cherish our freedom and maybe take it for granted, but that freedom has only come at a price, the cost in human lives - our Nation's Armed Forces' lives.

There have been various times in our Nation's history when our shores have been threatened and nearly lost, which would have resulted in us living under an oppressive regime, where peaceful protest would not be allowed.

It is worth remembering that there are many areas around the world where any form of protest is considered a crime. Two such occasions spring to mind:

A century ago in 1915, the intention of the Central Powers was to invade Britain. The European war had become finely balanced and the attempt to isolate Turkey with the Dardanelles' campaign had failed. The Commonwealth nature of the Allied Forces at Gallipoli demonstrated the global nature of the conflict. Its failure meant that the Central Powers could once again focus their efforts on the Western Front and Britain.

The numbers of lives lost at Gallipoli, many from this area, were horrendous, but next year we will remember an even greater sacrifice from the Battle of the Somme, Britain's most costly battle in human lives.

The second occasion was seventy-five years ago when Germany was poised to invade our country, once they had control of the air. The Battle of Britain was won, just, but at a dreadful cost in skilled pilots' lives.

On Remembrance Sunday when we stand in memory of those who gave their lives, we should remember that they did so for us, and that we may live in a free country.
